"I worked in the food service industry for 26 years," she said. "The money was good and living in Atlanta wasn't cheap."

After retiring early, and facing some personal and family issues, Gloria moved home to Caruthersville, where her parents were still living.

And though she lived comfortably in Atlanta for decades, now on a fixed income, Gloria has needed assistance from time to time, so she visits Southeast Missouri Food Bank distributions to supplement her groceries.

"There are things I need," she said, "and my fixed income only pays the bills, so I'm looking for a part-time job now."

She said the food she receives is a big help.

"Receiving this feels fantastic, because food is truly expensive and this is food that's actually going to last me," Gloria said.



## **Earn Tax Credits with Year-End Donations**

If you're planning to donate before the end of the year, you may consider making a gift that will also earn you tax credits.

Southeast Missouri Food Bank has Neighborhood Assistance Program (NAP) tax credits for qualified donors. NAP allows business owners/principals, farmers and rental property owners to donate \$1,000 or more and receive a 50 percent credit on state taxes. So, a \$5,000 donation may qualify for a \$2,500 credit to be used over 5 years.

The food bank directs proceeds from NAP donations to our Foods 2 Encourage efforts, using the funds to purchase nutritious food for food-insecure households in southeast Missouri.
