Walmart Supercenter Holds Thanksgiving Food Drive for Neighbors Facing Hunger

SIKESTON, **MO** (**Nov. 16**, **2023**) – Shoppers at the Cape Girardeau Walmart Supercenter will have an opportunity to help neighbors facing hunger in the days before Thanksgiving.

The store will have food drive collection bins set up Saturday through Wednesday, and greeters will be handing out a wish list of food items to benefit Southeast Missouri Food Bank.

"The holidays can be a stressful time, especially for families facing hunger," said Joey Keys, chief executive officer of Southeast Missouri Food Bank. "It's hard to think about a special holiday meal when you're already worried about paying bills and having enough to eat. Cape Girardeau Walmart Supercenter's food drive couldn't come at a better time, as more people turn to the food bank for help during the holiday season."

Some of the most-needed items shoppers can purchase include shelf-stable proteins and canned items such as fruits, vegetables and soups. All donated items should be non-perishable.

Southeast Missouri Food Bank serves 80,000 individuals each month through a network of 140 partner agencies and other programs. The food bank's 16-county service area has some of the highest rates of hunger in the state, where one in six families and one in five children are food insecure.
